

At St Anne's all governors and staff accept responsibility for all children and are committed to meeting their pastoral, social academic and physical needs within all aspects of our school life.

The Government provides funding to assist schools to improve the quality of PE and Sports Activities. Schools are "free to choose the best way of using the money"

For the Academic Year 2017 – 2018

Provision at St Anne's will be made in the following ways:

- Facilitate children's access to a qualified sports coach. Children from Year 1 to Year 6 have access to the Manchester City Community Sports Coach each week.
- Additional Multisport after school club led by Manchester City coach. This is open to all Key Stage 2 children.
- Every child in Nursery and Reception has a weekly session with the qualified Sports Coach from Manchester City in the Community. This active session is designed specifically for Early Years, with many activities being built on a familiar story. There is a focus on Communication and language in addition to physical activity.
- Competitive sporting activities with other schools, allowing our children to compete against children in other schools.
- Miss Murphy has met with Tameside Sports to ensure a greater range of inter-schools competition for this year.
- All teaching staff and some support staff will attend lessons alongside the sports coach, empowering them with knowledge of and skills in a range of sports. This will ensure the teaching of sport to be sustainable across all phases of school.
- Invest in new games equipment to ensure a full range of skills are encountered.
- Replenish playground equipment to ensure games can be played throughout play and lunchtimes.
- Promote the Lunchtime club, especially for gymnastics and social skills.
- Additional dance lessons to promote Dance within the curriculum.

Reporting PE and Sports Premium to Parents

It is the responsibility of the governors to inform parents of the expenditure of the PE and Sports Premium.

St Anne's RC Primary School will publish details of a report online annually.

This report aims to detail

- information on how the PE and Sports Premium has been used within school
- attainment and progress as a result of the Premium paid to the school.
- Sports coach to input data in consultation with class teachers.
- Planning for spending in the forthcoming year

A report on these areas is considered by The Curriculum and Standards and The Personnel and Finance Committees of St Anne's Governing Body each term. This information is informed by teachers' formative and summative assessment, reports provided by the sports coach and planning for future learning.

This is the case for all groups of children from Year 1 through to Year 6.

Premium Grant Spending 2016 - 2017

Objectives of spending Pupil Premium Grant:

- Provide a range of skills and experiences through sport with a qualified sports coach
(two thirds funded by Premier League for 1 year)
- Encourage children to partake of a range of sports
- CPD Opportunities for subject manager
- CPD and sustainability of teaching and learning across school.

- Access to inter schools competitions
- Encourage a transfer of skills across sport
- Encourage healthy competition by working together and with other schools
- Provide additional breakfast, lunch and after school experiences.
- Nurture a love of a healthy lifestyle, including sport/exercise.

Social Skills and Overcoming barriers to learning

- All children to work co-operatively in team games
- Access to “club” without huge cost to parents
- Funding for Pupil Premium children to access additional sporting activities
- Extension of school day without huge cost to parents
- Opportunity to experience working alongside children from other classes/schools
- Opportunity to experience healthy competition.
- Experience professional sporting event.

IMPACT

- More children won an individual medal at the Tameside Catholic School’s swimming Gala March 2015, and 2016 Catholic Schools Football winners 2016.
- Year 3 and 4 children represented St Anne’s in the Catholic Schools Swimming Gala, winning an array of individual and Team medals and building on the success of 2015.
- St Anne’s won an overall Team swimming trophy for the first time ever in 2016!
- St Anne’s won a team trophy for the Upper Key Stage 2 Boys in the “Large Schools” Category, competing against two form entry schools for the first time ever!
- There are increased numbers in all extra curricular sports clubs.
- Key Stage 2 girls football team came “Runners-up” in the Catholic schools cup.
- Our Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 children have taken part in Dance festivals in and out of school and are now signing up for Holiday clubs with the dance teacher.
- Key Stage 1 have taken part in inter schools competitions.
- St Anne’s has hosted the KS1 Multisport event for Tameside Catholic Schools
- Years 4 and 5 children have visited Lancashire Cricket Club for the day.
- All Year 6 children have had access to ski-ing and tubing.
- St Anne’s Year 3 and 4 Girls won the overall Catholic Schools Cross Country events 2016
- The KS2 football Team are champions of the Tameside Schools for the second year running!
- Year 5 children took part in an inter- school football event at the Manchester City Academy.

The following area was not fully achieved. Years 4 and 5 did attend a cricket day at Lancashire Cricket Club.

Reduced charges in the cost of a coach for Key Stages 1 and 2 meant that we were able to invest in a specialist coach for the Early Years Foundation Stage and in Gymnastics training and model lessons for staff with our children. This was in advance of the planned action for 2017-2018.

This has been so successful this year that we intend to further invest in this level of physical activity for this academic year at least. Our contributions to Manchester City have doubled but this is still being supported by the Premier League.

We anticipate our spending to be more than the allocated grant this year.
