

Covid-19 Catch Up Money

COVID-19 Government's Exceptional Circumstances Grant (Catch-up grant funding):

To date (February 2021) we have received £4,220. We are expecting £9,805 before the end of March and should have received a total of £16,000 by 2022.

Several research-based intervention programmes have been purchased to support children with additional needs and plug gaps as result of the national lockdowns. All are accessible on-line, which is very good for those children home learning who have additional needs. The interventions were recommended by school's Educational Psychologist. These include:

- Snap science at a cost of £535.
- Wellcom tracking tool £102
- Nessy. Nessy programs are designed to help children of all abilities learn to read, write, spell and type, especially those who learn differently, including mainstream, EAL, home school and students with dyslexia. Initially 10 licences at £240 each were purchased. Subsequently, a further 18 licences at £360 have been purchased.
- Dynamo Maths. Dynamo Maths identifies and supports pupils at risk of developmental dyscalculia and pupils who are performing significantly below their peers in maths. Five licences have been bought purchased at a yearly cost of £450 with an additional 25 at a cost of £27.29 per child bringing it to a total of £682
- Speech Link is a KS2 language intervention package. An initial cost of £510, including set up in KS2
- Tracking system for WELLCOM is a speech and language toolkit for screening and intervention in the Early Years. The cost is £80
- Boxall profile. The Boxall Profile is an invaluable resource for the assessment of children and young people's social, emotional and behavioural development. The whole school package costs £350.
- An additional 11 iPads have been ordered at a cost of £245 each making a total cost of £2,695
